Treasurer/Tax Collector Teresa Sphonhlz announced a vote that Governor Baker will be making a recommendation tomorrow regarding legislation for tax payments due to the COVID-19.

Motion by Mark, second by George, passed unanimously to postpone the Caucus, Town Meeting and Town Election.

Motion by Brian, second by Mark, passed unanimously to not publish the Annual Town Report Book at this time. We will publish and mail the FY2021 Warrant which is required by law but hold off on the book. If time allows later in the year we will try to collect all reports and print the book at that time.
