Sandisfield FY18 Housing Rehabilitation Project:

The funding is provided by the Massachusetts Department of Housing and Community Development and would provide **0% interest, deferred, forgivable loan up to \$40,000** to make critical repairs to your home. SBET, Southern Berkshire Elderly Transportation Services:

SBET provides transportation services for people age 55 and up, or at any age with a disability who are unable to transport themselves. Door to door service is provided, along with personal assistance required for the trip. (A 24 hour minimal advance notice is required, as well as a \$10-15 round trip fee, depending on the distance of the trip, plus \$2 for each additional stop). Elder Services of Berkshire County, (ESBC):

ESBC offers help in getting into programs assisting elders, individuals with disabilities, and their families, in accessing a comprehensive range of services that support older adults and individuals with disabilities so that they can maintain well-being and independence in the community. Some of the services available include: homecare services, meals-on-wheels, information on senior health insurance and employment, protective services, prescription drug programs and insurance, senior dining centers, money management help, options counseling, caregiver support, respite care, and more.
