Town of Sandisfield Select Board

Minutes for Select Board meeting held on Tuesday, October 24, 2023 at 7:00PM at the Town Hall, 66 Sandisfield Road, Sandisfield, MA

1. Call to order: Note that the meeting is being recorded

2. Board of Assessors in for Tax Classification Hearing

Roger Brown reports that the first step in the tax classification process is determining the valuations to assure full and fair value of properties in Town. Certification is required next, and Roger confirms Sandisfield was certified by the state two weeks ago. This was a five-year certification, which is more in-depth than normal. During this meeting the Board of Assessors will decide what the tax policy is, afterwhich the BOA will submit the results of the meeting to the state and until this happens taxes cannot be raised.

The results of the valuation process proved a 10% increase in assessed values for the residential portion of the Town. Personal property valuations increased slightly higher than 10%.

The first decision the Select Board must consider is a split tax rate. A split tax rate shifts taxes paid by residential taxes to the other categories (ie; commercial, industrial, personal property). A split tax rate does not change the amount of taxes being collected, but instead changes who is paying. A split tax rate would be more appealing in a Town with a large industrial base. Roger notes that should the Select Board consider the split tax rate, it would increase the taxes for all property in Chapter. Steve recommends more analysis on the effect of a split tax rate, and Roger recommends holding a Work Session with the BOA.

Roger reviews the different types of exemptions. Residential exemptions would benefit full-time residents, as opposed to other residents (ie; second homeowners, renters, etc). Small commercial exemptions only apply to businesses with fewer than 11 employees and have less than a million dollars in valuation. This exemption would increase the tax rates on other commercial and industrial properties. Open-space classifications are similar to conservation; this would increase residential taxes. Senior means-tested is an exemption different from a senior tax abatement, as it would be required to be taken out of the tax rate. This is typically a 10% reduction.

The Select Board agrees that a Work Session and more discussion is necessary before considering a split tax rate or any of the exemptions.

A motion was made, seconded and so voted to accept a single tax rate for all categories.

- Transfer the sum of \$2,500.00 from Emergency Management Expenses to Emergency Management Grant to cover the cost of unreimbursed expenses
- Appropriate the sum of \$7,976.67 from General Stabilization to pay the town's portion of 5% of the Assistance to Firefighters Grant award
- Appropriate the sum of \$7,500 from General Stabilization to the Reserve Fund to pay for FY24 unforeseen legal expenses
- Appropriate the sum of \$10,000 from General Stabilization to the Voc-Tech account to pay for FY24 student transportation expenses
- Appropriate the sum of \$9,716.51 from General Stabilization to pay bills from prior fiscal years

6. Discuss FY25 Budget Policy Target

The Select Board agrees to ask all Departments to level fund their budgets for FY25, or explain in detail their reasons for any increase. A letter will be sent to all Department heads outlining this request, as well as a budget form to fill out and return.

A private citizen submitted documentation regarding the Fire Department fleet and its inspection status to the Select Board. Steve reports this item will be tabled, as it should

be reviewed in executive session. Kathleen McCormick, legal representation attending the meeting "on behalf of the Sandisfield Fire Department" requests copies of the documents submitted to the Select Board.
