The Special Town Meeting was called to order at 9:57am and adjourned at 9:59am. There were 18 voters present along with Town Council Jerome J. Scully.

Article 1. The Town voted unanimously to transfer \$55,000 from Free Cash to Snow and Ice to cover the overrun expenses for this fiscal year winter.

RESULTS OF THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING May 12, 2001

The Annual Town Meeting was called to order at 10:00am and was adjourned at 11:35am. There were 27 voters present along with Town Council Jerome J. Scully.

- e. Town Gas Inspector 2,500
- f. Town Dog Officer 2,500

which revolving funds together shall not exceed the sum of seventeen thousand five hundred dollars (\$17,500), which shall be under the control of the Town Treasurer, which shall be accounted for separately and to which shall be credited only the departmental receipts received in connection with the programs supported by each revolving fund; further to authorize the Town Treasurer to expend from such funds in accordance with Chapter 44 Section 53 E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the General Laws, provided however that said expenditures for all revolving funds shall not exceed the receipts for such funds.

- Article 55. The Town voted unanimously to appropriate \$50,000 from Free Cash to reduce the FY2002 Tax Rate.
- Article 56. The Town voted unanimously to accept Prock Hill as a public way.
- Article 57. Other Business: The Selectboard has been asked to look into the possibility of paying a stipend to the Boards and Commissions that are not currently being paid and to come back to next years Town Meeting with an answer.
