RESULTS OF THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING May 12, 2007

The Annual Town Meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. There were 47 registered voters present along with Town Council Jerome Scully. Moderator Barbara Cormier opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Article 2.	The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate for the Moderator \$300: \$150 for Salaries and \$150 for Expenses.
Article 3.	The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate \$5,000 for Administrative costs for a Grant Writer.
Article 4.	The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate for the General Government \$28,917: \$22,517 for Salaries and \$6,400 for Expenses.
Article 5.	The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate \$17,030 for the Administrative Assistant to the Board of Selectmen.

Article 63. The Town voted unanimously to appropriate \$50,000 from Free Cash to reduce the FY2008 Tax Rate.

The Town voted by majority to approve the following proposed bylaw: Article 64. The Moderator shall decide all votes. If a two-thirds, four fifths, or nine-tenths vote is required, he/she may declare and record the vote as meeting the requirement, providing however, that if a vote so declared is immediately questioned by three or more voters, he/she shall verify the vote by polling the voters.
