## RESULTS OF THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING May 13, 2000

The Annual Town Meeting was called to order at 10:05am and was adjourned at 10:53am. There were 23 voters present along with Town Council Attorney Jerome J. Scully.

Article 1.	The Town voted unanimously to accept the reports of the
Article 2.	Town Officers. The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate the sum of \$104,584 for Highways & Bridges Maintenance.
Article 3.	The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate the sum of \$28,700 for repairs to Prock Hill Road.
Article 4.	The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate the sum of \$114,734 for Snow and Ice Removal to keep roads open in the winter.

Article 49. The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,120 for a Fireproof File Cabinet for the Board of Assessors.

Article 50. The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,858 for the Board of Assessors Annual Operating Expense.

Article 51. The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate the sums of money, as may be necessary to pay the expenses of the various departments as follows:

Article 52. The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapt. 44, Sec. 53 E½ as amended by section 72 and 73 of the acts of 1994 for the Town Sanitary Inspector Department for Fiscal Year 2001 operating budget in the amount of \$5,000 and that the receipts of the Town Sanitary Inspector be designated to this account.

Article 53. The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapt. 44, Sec. 53 E<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> as amended by section 72 and 73 of the acts of 1994 for the Town Plumbing Inspector Department for Fiscal Year 2001 operating budget in the amount of \$2,500 and that the receipts of the Town Plumbing Inspector be designated to this account.

- Article 54. The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapt. 44, Sec. 53 E1/2 as amended by section 72 and 73 of the acts of 1994 for the Town Building Inspector Department for Fiscal Year 2001 operating budget in the amount of \$2,500 and that the receipts of the Town Building Inspector be designated to this account.
- Article 55. The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapt. 44 Sec. 53 E1/2 as amended by section 72 and 73 of the acts of 1994 for the Town Wiring Inspector Department for Fiscal Year 2001 operating budget in the amount of \$2,500 and that the receipts of the Town Wiring Inspector be designated to this account.
- Article 56. The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund under the provisions of M.G.L. Chapt. 44 Sec. 53 E1/2 as amended by section 72 and 73 of the acts of 1994 for the Town Gas Inspector Department for Fiscal Year 2001 operating budget in the amount of \$2,500 and that the receipts of the Town Gas Inspector be designated to this account.
- Article 57. The Town voted unanimously to authorize and direct the Board of Selectmen to sell a parcel of real estate situated on Dodd Road (Map 414 Parcel 79), consisting of approximately 5.24 acres of land and recently conveyed to the Town by Irene B. Henry, to the highest bidder at a purchase price of no less than \$5,500.00.

Article 58. The Town voted unanimously to accept the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 140, Section 147A empowering the Town to enact by-laws relective to regulation of dogs and entitling the town to retain all license fees and fines rather than turning over such license fees and fines to the County.

Article 59. The Town voted unanimously to accept the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40, Section 22F empowering any municipal board or officer to issue a license, permit, certificate or to render a service and fix reasonable fees for all such licenses, permits or certificates issued pursuant to statutes or regulations wherein the entire proceeds of the fee remain with such issuing town.

Article 60. The Town voted unanimously to establish a revolving fund under Massachusetts General Law 44, Sec. 53E1/2 as amended by section 72 and 73 of the acts of 1994 to fund the expenses for the licensing of dogs and related expenses in Fiscal Year 2001 operating budget in the amount of \$2,500 and the receipts from dog fees be designated to this account.

Article 61. The Town voted unanimously to appropriate \$30,000 from Free Cash to reduce the FY2001 Tax Rate.

Article 62. No business transacted under this Article.
