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RESULTS OF THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING May 14, 2016

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Moderator Jean Atwater William with the Pledge of Allegiance. There were 56 registered voters present along with Town Council Jonathan Silverstein. The Finance Committee approved all the articles.

Article 1.	The Town voted unanimously to accept the reports of the Town Officers.
Article 2.	The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate for the Moderator \$300: \$150 for Salaries and \$150 for Expenses.
Article 3.	The Town voted by majority to raise and appropriate for the Town Administrator \$39,700: \$37,000 for Salaries and \$2,700 for Expenses.
Article 4.	The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate for the General Government \$21,255: \$12,000 for Salaries and \$9,255 for Expenses.
Article 5.	The Town voted by majority to raise and appropriate for Legal Services \$10,000 for Expenses.
Article 6.	The Town voted unanimously to raise and appropriate for the Town Accountant \$13,232: \$11,232 for Salaries and \$2,000 for Expenses.

Which specified revolving funds shall each be accounted for separately and to which shall be credited only the departmental receipts received in connection with the programs supported by each revolving fund as specified above, with such funds to be expended by the Town Treasurer to the limits set forth therein for purposes of paying costs associated with the particular programs supported by the specified fees; provided however, that consistent with law expenditures from any revolving funds shall not exceed the receipts maintained in such funds.

- Article 68. The Town voted unanimously to appropriate and transfer from Free Cash \$50,000 to pay the last of four payments for the New Hartford Road Loan.
- Article 69. The Town voted unanimously to appropriate \$19,800 for Technology Upgrades and to meet that appropriation transfer \$19,800 from the Stabilization Account.

Article 70. The Town voted unanimously to delete the existing Town of Sandisfield's Zoning Bylaws (Chapter IX) adopted on November 9, 1963, as it may have thereafter from time to time been amended, in its entirety and replace it with the new Town of Sandisfield's Zoning Bylaws (Chapter IX) dated May, 2016, as proposed by the Planning Board, all as set forth in a document with the same name on file and available for public review in the Office of the Town Clerk and on the Town's website and made available at the Annual Town Meeting.

Summary from the Planning Board: The primary purpose of this warrant article is to reorganize the zoning bylaws in a logical and orderly manner making it easier to read and understand without making a large number of changes that alter the substance of the zoning bylaws. A secondary purpose of this warrant article is to clarify the permitting processes and the administration of the zoning bylaws.

- To help explain the changes the Planning Board has prepared an annotated version of the proposed zoning bylaws which identifies and explains each of the proposed changes between the existing bylaw and the proposed bylaw. A copy of the Town of Sandisfield's Zoning Bylaws (Chapter IX) dated May 2016 as proposed by the Planning Board and the annotated version of the Same are both on File in the Office of the Town Clerk.
- Article 73. The Town voted by majority pursuant to the provisions of G. L. c.41, section 55, to authorize the Board of Selectmen to appoint a Town Accountant, who shall perform the duties and possess the powers of Town Accountants as defined in G.L. c.41, sections 50 to 53, inclusive.

Note for the record: there was a typographical error in the numbering of the articles between articles 70 to 73. Article 73 should have been number 71.
