- Article 60. The Town voted unanimously to appropriate \$50,000 from Free Cash to reduce the Fiscal Year 2004 Tax Rate.
- Motion was made, seconded and passed by majority to not Article 61. read this article Citizen's Petition #1. Article 61 was defeated by majority.
- Article 62. The Town defeated by majority Citizen's Petition #2 to direct the Selectmen to form an ad hoc committee to investigate the feasibility of establishing a Town Manager for the Town of Sandisfield. The committee should have 5 members and be requested to provide a preliminary report at the next Town Meeting. Members of the committee should include: 1 representative from the Finance Committee, 1 representative from the Board of Selectmen, 1 representative from the Treasurers Office, 1 representative from the Fire Department and 1 representative from the Council on Aging.
- Article 63. Other Business: Town Clerk Dolores Harasyko extended a her appreciation and thanks to Elaine Ziegler, Assistant Town Clerk for all her continued help and hard work on the Annual Town Report. Elaine received a round of applause from the audience. Bob Donaldson announced that there were new exemption numbers that may benefit the seniors and advised that the seniors should look into this.
