## WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING May 12, 2001

To the Constable of the Town of Sandisfield

## Greetings:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town, qualified to vote in elections and town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall (3 SilverBrook Road) Saturday, May 12, 2001 at 10:00 am for the transaction of town business and on Monday, May 14, 2001 at 10:00 am until 8:00 pm for election of officers.

- Article 1. To see if the town will vote to accept the reports of the town officers.
- Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$107,584 or any other sum, for Highways & Bridges Maintenance.
- Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$117,000 or any other sum, for Snow and Ice Removal to keep roads open in the winter.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$34,000 or any other sum, for Machinery Maintenance.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriatae the sum of \$7,565 or any other sum, for a Communication System for Emergencies and Town Crew Communication.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from Chapter 127 the sum of \$88,839 or any other sum for projects that have been approved by the Mass Highway Department.

Article 54. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the use of revolving funds for following programs and purposes:

- a. Town Sanitary Inspector \$5,000
- b. Town Plumbing Inspector 2,500
- c. Town Building Inspector 2,500
- d. Town Wiring Inspector 2,500
- e. Town Gas Inspector 2,500
- f. Town Dog Officer 2,500

which revolving funds together shall not exceed the sum of seventeen thousand five hundred dollars (\$17,500), which shall be under the control of the Town Treasurer, which shall be accounted for separately and to which shall be credited only the departmental receipts received in connection with the programs supported by each revolving fund; further to authorize the Town Treasurer to expend

from such funds in accordance with Chapter 44 Section 53 E  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the General Laws, provided however that said expenditures for all revolving funds shall not exceed the receipts for such funds, or to take any other action relative thereto.

Article 55. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$50,000 or any other sum from Free Cash to reduce the FY2002 Tax Rate.

Article 56. To see if the Town will vote to accept Prock Hill as a public way, or to take any other action relative thereto.

Article 57. To transact any other business that may legally come before the Town Meeting.

To vote by ballot on May 14, 2001 for Town Officers and terms thereof as follows:

One Moderator for one year

One Selectman for three years

One Tax Collector for three years

One Auditor for one year

One Assessor for three years

One School Committee Member for three years

One Board of Health for three years

One Board of Health for two years

One Planning Board for four years

One Planning Board for five years

One Library Trustee for five years

The Town Hall (3 SilverBrook Road) will open at 10 am Saturday, May 12, 2001, for the Town Meeting and the polls will be open on Monday, May 14, 2001, at 10 am at the Town Hall (3 SilverBrook Road) for Town Elections and shall be closed at 8 pm.

You are directed to serve this warrant by posting true and attested copies thereof at three public places within the Town of Sandisfield seven days at least before the time of said Town Meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of the warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at or before the time of holding said Town Meeting.
