which revolving funds together shall not exceed the sum of forty-nine thousand dollars (\$49,000), which shall be under the control of the Town Treasurer, which shall be accounted for separately and to which shall be credited only the departmental receipts received in connection with the programs supported by each revolving fund; further to authorize the Town Treasurer to expend from such funds in accordance with Chapter 44 Section 53 E1/2 of the Federal Laws, provided however, that said expenditures for all revolving funds shall not exceed the receipts for such funds, or to take any other action relative thereto.

- Article 67. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$50,000 or any other sum from Free Cash to pay the first of four payments for the New Hartford Road Loan.
- Article 68. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire the following land parcels and/or rights in land parcels, or any other necessary land parcels, for the purpose of obtaining a secure and public right of way. This will allow for the construction and roadway safety improvements of the Clark Road Extension Bridge No. S-03-005. As currently designed, the project will consist of five (5) parcels, consisting of one (1) permanent easement consisting of 160 square feet, and four (4) of temporary easements consisting of 22,790 of square feet.

Further, that the Selectmen may acquire these parcels, or modification of these parcels or other required parcels through all legal means, including donation, purchase or eminent domain, and further, to acquire said parcels. The subject parcels are currently identified on plans drafted by Massachusetts Department of Transportation Highway Division. Which plans are available for inspection at the Town Clerk's office, or take any other action relative thereto.

Article 69. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Costs Associated with the Clark Road Bridge Replacement Project \$10,000 or any other sum.

To vote by ballot on May 20, 2013 for Town Officers and terms thereof as follows:

One Moderator for one year One Selectman for three years

One Tax Collector for three years

One Auditor for one year

One Assessor for three years

One School Committee Member for three years

One Board of Health Member for three years

One Planning Board Member for five years

The Town Hall (3 Silverbrook Road) will open at 10 am Saturday, May 18, 2013 for the Town Meeting and the polls will be open on Monday, May 20, 2013 at 10 am at the Town Hall (3 Silverbrook Road) for Town Elections and shall be closed at 8 pm.

You are directed to serve this warrant by posting true and attested copies thereof at three public places within the Town of Sandisfield seven days at least before the time of said Town Meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of the warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at or before the time of holding said Town Meeting.
